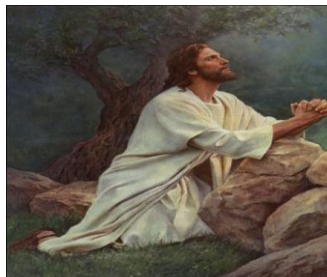
Key Facts

Jesus went to listen to scriptures in the Synagogue

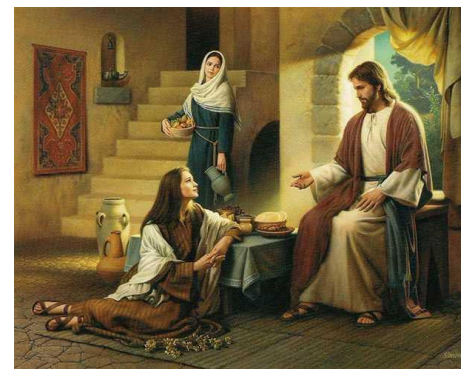


Jesus prayed to his Father

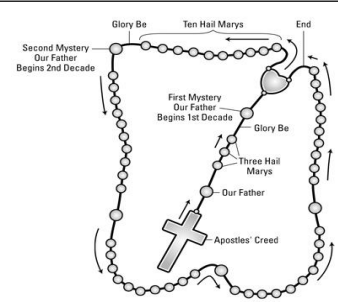


What Gospel Virtues did Mary and Joseph show?
