- Behaviour and courtesy We are taking a very serious line with behaviour and attitudes, parents. We have a few children who have completely forgotten expectations linked to respect for staff; including refusals to co-operate, back chatting and a general air of disrespect and non co-operation. This is non-negotiable here at St Mary's. Please make sure that your child is aware of your expectations. I look forward to your full support on this Lockdown rustiness.
- Drop off and collections These have been smooth in 99% of cases, thank you for your co-operation. Y3 and Y4 parents, please remember your youngest siblings need to be brought to the entrance of your older siblings, as specified in the Lockdown Letter No.7 (attached once more). There is no requirement for any parent EXCEPT those with children in EYFS (Nursery and Reception) to be travelling to and from different gates any more. That means the site is clear of parents more quickly- making us all safer.
- **COVID vigilance** -Please remember not to send your child if you feel they are unwell. This protects others and reduces the spread of the virus
- Parking. Thank you to those parents in Y3 and Y6 who have now responded to the police cones that are visual on Cranleigh Close, and to those who are parking safely or who have made alternative arrangements, whether via the church car park or other means. Residents and other parents have shared their appreciation with both Mr leek and myself, as the parking was becoming concerning. I have also had a phone call from the Local Authority as a direct result of a complaint and I have 6 registration numbers which have been passed to me and the local police by residents and other parents. We live in a congested area, right on the doorstep of a busy local secondary school. Please plan your parking and your journey to accommodate that and avoid a fine or a caution.
- Site Security- Thank you, everyone. This is working really well. Our only request is that the Nursery parents resist the temptation to prop open the Pedestrian Gates. They will eventually have a floor bolt which will manually keep them open, however please don't force them whilst we wait for that to be finished. Many thanks.
