The Qur'an is the name of the Muslim holy book. Muslims believe it is a record of the exact words revealed by Allah through the Arch Angel Gabriel to Prophet Muhammad.

Muhammad memorised the words and wrote them down.

Muhammad used these words to live his daily life and in the words he spoke.

Therefore, lots of the things Muhammad did and said were remembered and recorded carefully.

As well as the Qur'an, the other sacred sources in Islam are the Sunnah (this contains practises and examples of the Prophet Muhammad's life) and the hadith (reports of what the Prophet Muhammad said or approved).

Muslims treat the Qur'an with a huge amount of respect as they believe it is literally from Allah and therefore every word is sacred.

The Qur'an is usually placed on a special wooden stand to be read.

Muslims believe how they should live their lives is all instructed within the Qur'an.

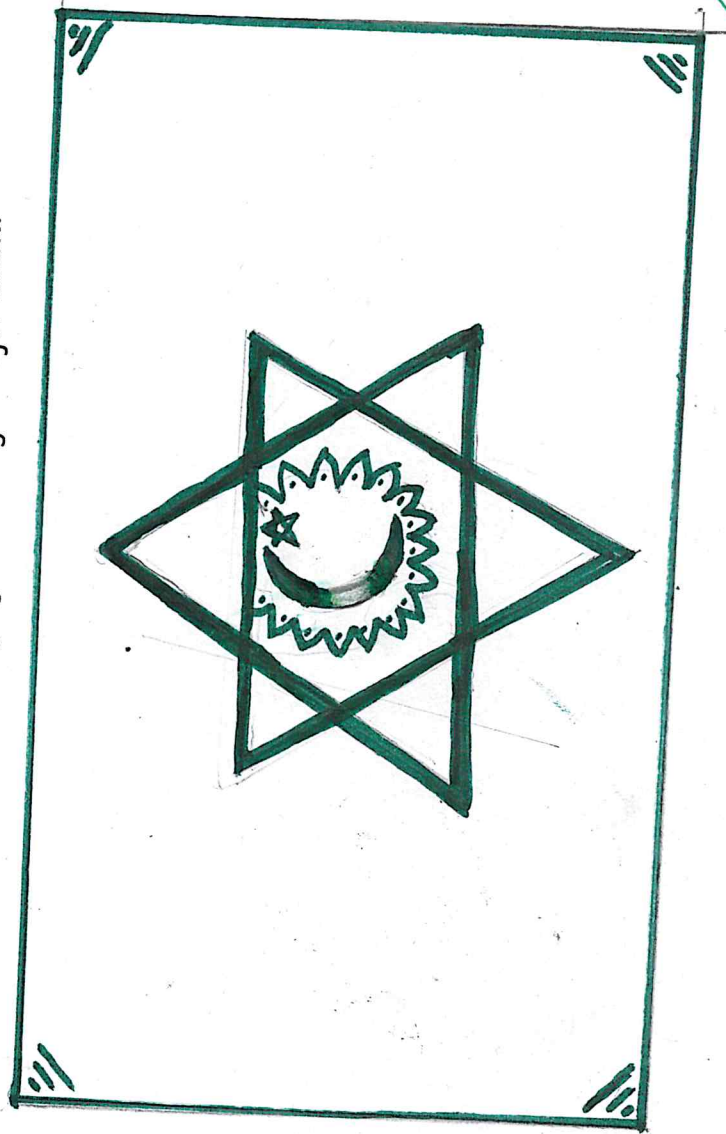
Can you design your own symbol for Islam?

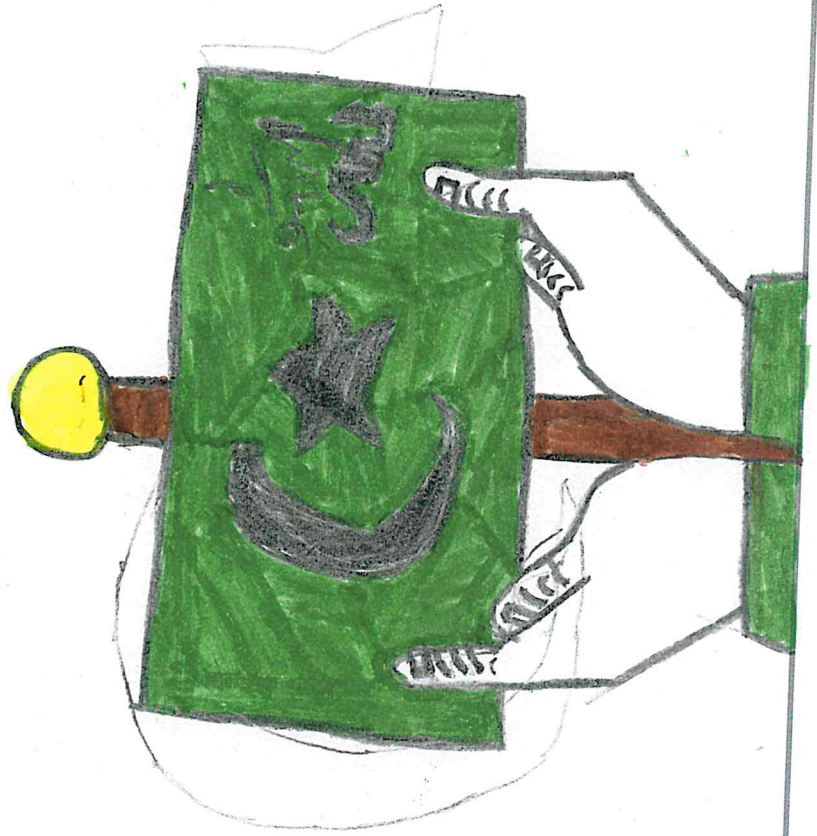

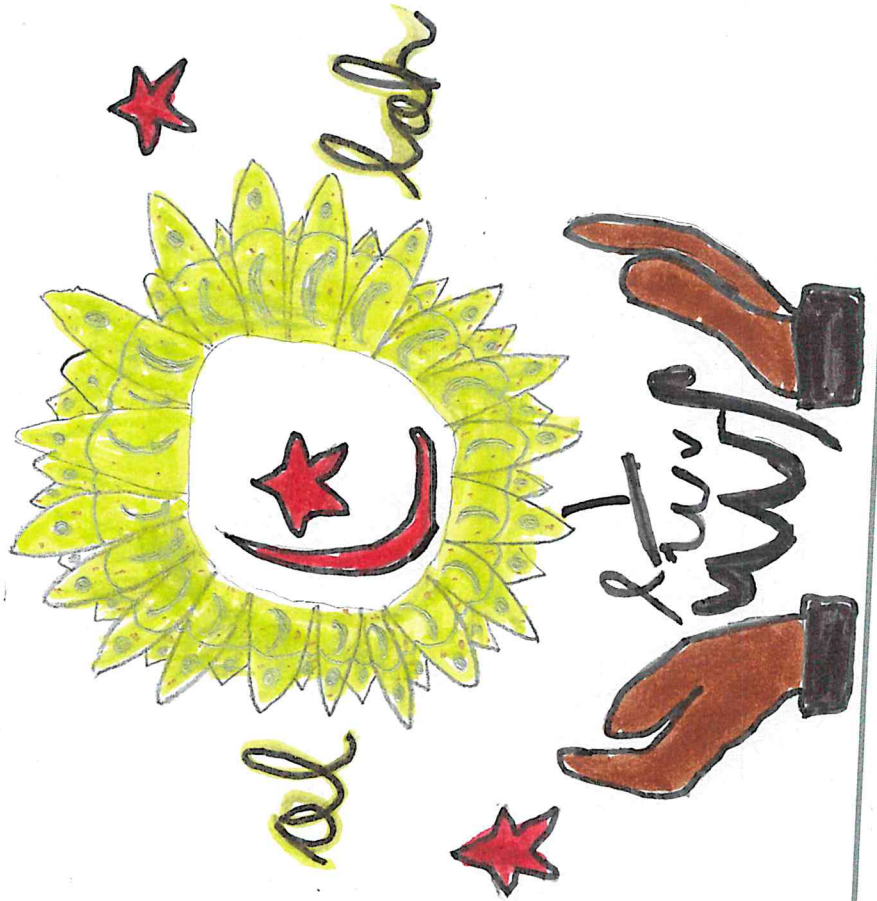

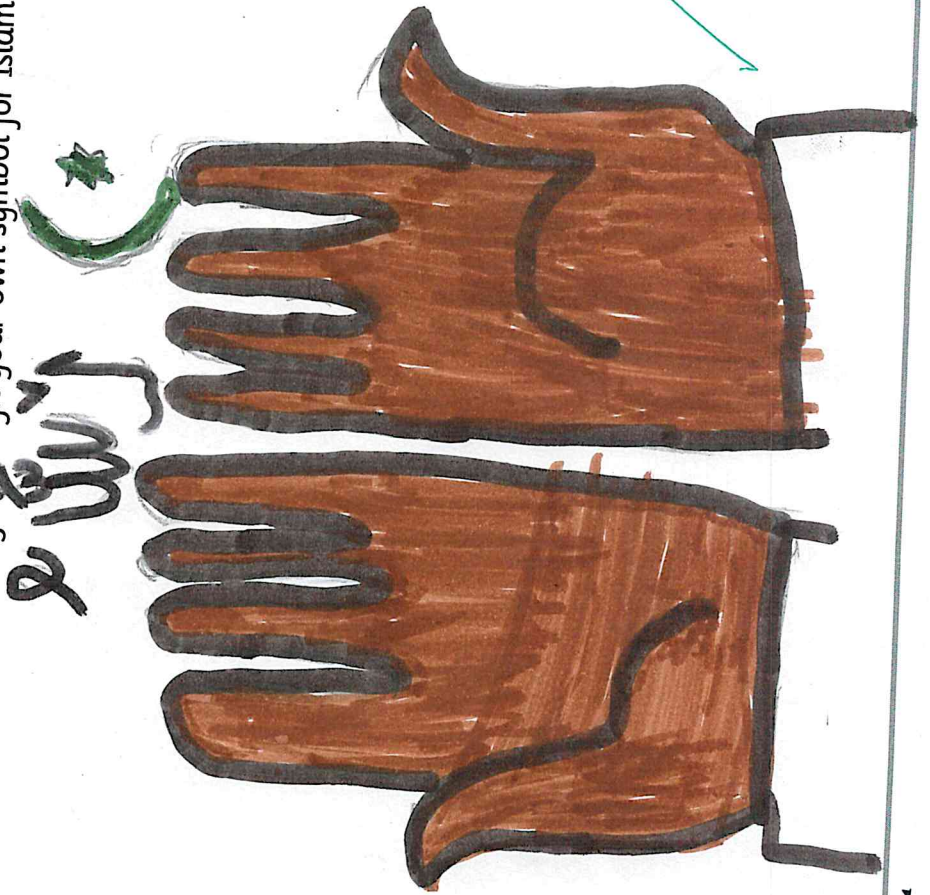
