And finally:-. Last weekend, with the Gospel drawing our attention to Christ the Good Shepherd, our focus was on the need to listen to the voice of the shepherd and to follow where he leads. Today's Gospel, however, takes us a little further in our understanding of what it is to be a Christian disciple. Not only must we listen to His voice, we must in reality be completely united to Him as the branches that 'bear much fruit' are to the vine. This intimate union with Christ, made possible by the mystery of the Incarnation, is only achievable when we allow ourselves to be 'pruned' by the action of the Holy Spirit. When we allow ourselves to be cleansed of all that gets in the way of our following of the Lord from being perfect and complete – our sinfulness. Seeking this perfect union with Christ is never going to be easy, but we must desire it, if the seed of faith sown in our hearts at Baptism is going to flower and bear fruit in our lives and in our time.
