

Key Facts

- Jesus was described as a light to the world at his Presentation.
- Simeon prayed that God had fulfilled his promise and had waited for this moment in the prayer Nunc dimittis.
- Jesus is baptised in the River Jordan. He is revealed as the beloved son.
- The signs and symbols of the Rite of Baptism remind us that Christians become the children of God through this Sacrament. They include White Baptismal garment reminding us that we are clothed with God's life. A Baptismal candle reminding us that we live in the light of Christ. The Oil of Chrism reminding us that we are anointed to live like Jesus. The giving of a Christian name reminding us that we are called by name to belong to God's family.
