Health and Safety Update

Summer Care / Hayfever:

We have a number of children who suffer with hay fever in school. This can be managed at home with medication from a pharmacy. Some medication can be one tablet a day, or $\frac{1}{2}$ a tablet in the morning and $\frac{1}{2}$ in the evening, depending on the age of your child. Please seek advice from your local pharmacy or your child's GP.

If your child suffers from hayfever, they can bring sunglasses to school to wear outdoors to reduce some of the symptoms. Wraparound sunglasses are best suited for this, as recommended on the NHS website regarding hayfever.

Please ensure that your child is equipped to be outside in warm weather – sun hats and sun cream applications are a must. We may have to restrict children's outdoor activities if we do not feel that they are appropriately safeguarded from the sun. (If older children are bringing in their own sun cream, this must not be shared between individuals.)

Medication

If you would like school staff to administer medication to your child, then it must be prescribed by a doctor.

Please ensure medication is handed in to the school office by yourself, as parental consent forms need to be completed before the medication is administered. Children must not bring any medication themselves into school, as it may get lost, or it may get ingested by another child.

Any medication you need to collect from school must be collected by parents at the school office please.
