Following on from the attendance information last week. Did you know?:

- 90% attendance is equivalent to missing approximately 100 hour long lessons in one academic year.
- If you take your child on a 2 week term time holiday, annual attendance can instantly drop to 95% (cause for concern).
- Learning is a progressive activity; each day's lessons build upon those
 of the previous day. Children cannot miss school and easily slot back
 into lessons (sequences of learning).
