And finally: This weekend, in the Gospel, St. John the Baptist bears witness to Christ as ‘the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world’. John’s ministry of “bearing witness to Christ” began even in his mothers womb, when he leapt for joy as the words of Mary reached his mother’s ear, and he encountered the nearness of his Lord in Mary’s womb.
