



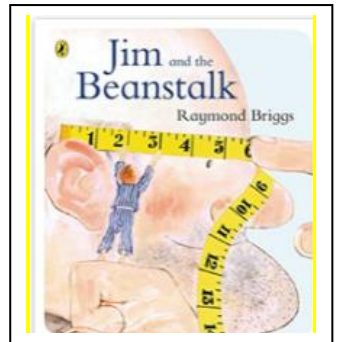
YEAR 1 - ENGLISH - JIM AND THE BEANSTALK KEY KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER
