Dear Parents,

- 1. Welcome back virtually and in person! Happy New Year. We are on Day 6 of 2021 and already we have a new normal to contend with. Team work is key and what a great start so far!
- 2. Thank you to staff for their total dedication to the changes and their flexible, speedy responses to the need to cater virtually and in the classroom, at the same time. I have heard from many, that the adaptations we have made, have really supported children's learning. We do listen, we do adapt where appropriate and we value your feedback.
- 3. Thank you to all, for your respect and cooperation with the necessary changes made on Monday evening. Thanks, also, to the very many parents who have recognised the need to adapt their plans to maintain a safe environment for the children and staff in the building. That is echoed in the way parents and children are arriving and leaving the building.
