
Where are we going? How shall we get there?

<u>Transport – Non</u> <u>fiction</u>

This book is part of the Oxford Reading Tree Fireflies series which offer a wide range of stimulating non-fiction titles for young children. This book invites the children to learn about different types of transport. It provides an opportunity for the children to read for information.

Aim- Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs. Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending. Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about non-fiction, Extend language when describing. Begin to write single words with sounds they can hear in order. Begin to write a sentence with a capital letter and a full stop.
