<u>Welcome to Advent</u> Our Advent wreath is on display in the hall. Our Gateway Christmas donation fund, for needy local children, is open - £3 so far. Our tree has arrived - and we look forward to it being decorated next week, with baubles and lightseach representing our compassion for others in our world. Our School Council will be decorating a tree for the Aldridge Tree Festival, also. We look forward to seeing pictures of this soon. (Please see the attached Flyer).

<u>After School Club changes to charges</u> Letters have been sent out last week, detailing the changes, effective from our return to school in January 2022. Please note the booking fees will be operative late December, in readiness for January 2022 Breakfast and After School Club.

Christmas Nativities and the Covid picture. We are watching government and local statistics carefully, currently. Our Covid numbers remain low at the moment, in school, with 5 confirmed cases in the last 10 days. This matches the local updates, with Aldridge confirmed cases dropping by 8% in the last 7 days. At the moment, we have said that the KS1 nativity will be shared with one class of parents at a time, as detailed in the attached letter. This will be at 2.30pm on the given days- with parents (no more than 2) needing to arrive with masks and only remove these when seated. It will be socially distanced and it will be shortened. Please be aware, however, that it is subject to change dependent on numbers of Covid cases locally and local advice. Thank you in anticipation for your full support. All other Christmas celebrations, including Early Years Advent activities and KS2 poems, songs etc, will be shared virtually, before the close of the term.
