- There is an NHS service available in Boots pharmacies, called NHS Pharmacy First. This service enables children and adults to get convenient access to advice and treatment where appropriate for seven common conditions, without the potential delay of waiting for a GP appointment. There is no need to make an appointment to access this service. It supports the following conditions for people in the age groups specified below:
  - Earache (aged 1-17)
  - Impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
  - Infected insect bites and stings (aged 1 year and over)
  - Sore throats (aged 5 years and over)
  - Sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)
  - UTIs (aged 16-64 years)
  - Shingles (aged 18 and over)
