Dear Parents,

Welcome back. It appears that you have brought the sun with you, too. It has been a great start to the new school term. Please find below a summary of events as we move through the Summer.

- Holy Communion preparations Y3 parents, please find the Y3 SACRAMENTAL tab on our school website. By tomorrow evening, all relevant letters and details, including a video detailing the children's learning, dress expectations for the big day, risk assessments etc, will be available via that tab. As with all church events, we will be restricted to 6 in each family /support bubble, with an exception made for larger immediate families. (Details to follow, via phone, for such families). Please keep a close eye on the tab to keep abreast of plans and expectations for the "Big Day". We pray for great weather to accommodate your outdoor celebrations after the Mass, also.
- End of term early finish on Wednesday 21st July from this term onwards, all end of terms here at St Mary of the Angels, will finish at the earlier time of 1.30pm. School collection on the final day of the Summer term will, therefore, be 1.25pm for Nursery, Y1,2 and 3 and 1.30pm for Reception, Y4, 5 and 6. Thank you to Governors for recognising and supporting staff wellbeing.
- School Fund Thank you for your generosity. This has been put to good use in the following ways since our return:
 - Your children have had a fabulous time planting "Positivity Pots" a name coined by our School Council, across this week (Y5,6 and 1 are tomorrow). They have been decorating stones with words that they wish to say Good bye to, from Lockdown, and then placing these in large pots of rainbow coloured plants (as specified by Mrs Smith and our school council). The results are truly lovely and will be available for you to see as next week unfolds. This has been possible as a direct result of your contributions to school fund.
