Data Protection – Live-streaming

Sunday 9.30am Mass, and all weekday Masses, will continue to be live-streamed. The camera is situated at the front of the church so that only the Sanctuary is visible. If, however, you are sitting on the right side of the church you will become visible, in a way in which you might be recognisable, for a brief moment as you return from receiving Holy Communion. If you do not wish to appear on the live-stream please inform one of the stewards who will ensure that you are seated on the left of the church.

The Ending of COVID Restrictions

The government has now announced that "all restrictions imposed in response to COVID-19 will be lifted on Monday 19th July". At the time of writing there have, as yet, been no guidelines from the Bishops' Conference. Whilst I am very much looking forward to removing all of the signs of these restrictions from the church, it is with caution that we must, and are going to, proceed. Whatever the instructions, for the time being, the Sunday Mass schedule will remain as it is; however, you will now be free to attend any of the Masses without having to 'Book in'. I am presuming that the use of facemasks will become, as in all other sectors, an individual choice. Once I have received the definitive guidelines from the Bishops' Conference I will publish them on the Homepage of the Parish Website, and then further clarify what steps we will be taking here in the parish on next weekend's Newsletter.
