And finally:-. The word Epiphany means manifestation. So for us the day of the Epiphany is the day that the Lord Jesus was shown in the flesh to all the nations. The wise men from the neighbouring pagan nations came to adore the infant Jesus bearing gifts. Therefore, by this we can understand how salvation is not just for the Jews but for all nations. This was a mystery to everyone, that God would come in our very flesh for the sake of the salvation of all mankind. Notice how there were many blocks and problems along their way but still God's providence triumphed. This will be the case for us too, as nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus, provided that we follow Him wholeheartedly. And where do they find Jesus? Yes, in Bethlehem but Matthew is even more precise. The Magi went into the house and "saw the child with His mother Mary." This will be the case for us too, when we go to Mary, we will find her Child - the Child Jesus.
