Jesus said, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.'

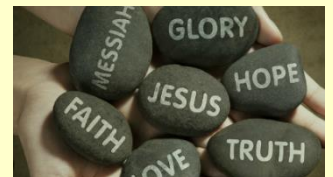
Gentle Jesus, compassionate and caring Good Shepherd,
