Church open for Public Masses

With the end of lockdown on 2nd December we can resume public celebrations of the Mass beginning on Thursday 3rd December. This Sunday, at 4.30pm, the church will be open for Private Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament for the final time. Next weekend we will return to the Mass schedule as it stood before lockdown: Saturday 6.00pm, Sunday 9.30am, 11.30am & 4.30pm. Could I therefore ask that, beginning next Saturday evening, you continue to attend the Mass that you were attending prior to the lockdown. As we return to church could I also remind you of the need to adhere to all of the instructions that were in place for Public Worship before lockdown.

Christmas Services

As of Monday there will be a page on the Parish Website called "Christmas Masses". On this page you will be able to complete a 'booking in form' to secure a place at one of the Christmas Masses. Public Masses will be celebrated on Christmas Eve at 7.00pm & 12midnight. On Christmas Day there will be Mass at 9.00am and 10.30am. I will also be celebrating Mass at 5.00pm on Christmas Eve, which will be live-streamed. At this Mass only the choir will be present in the church enabling us to have a sung Mass with carols. The live-stream will commence at 4.30pm with a Carol Service.
