This week, the children have taken part in induction week within their classes. This includes a re-cap on some key areas of learning covered in autumn term. It includes work on the British values - looking at individual liberty and mutual respect, our behaviour and safeguarding policies and procedures (including who are trusted adults the children can go to if they have any worries). The children have also been learning about their emotional resilience and wellbeing - dealing with emotions and calming and regulating techniques. As well as this, the children enjoyed workshops from our Street Team visitors, learning about how to stay safe when using the internet and safety measures for age appropriate apps and games. Over the coming weeks, we will share online safety information with you, according to the things that children have said they use online.
