And finally:- At the plenary meeting of the Bishops' of England and Wales, which took place in Cardiff last week, the Bishops' discussed the return of the Sunday Obligation following it suspension in response to the Covid Pandemic. In the letter released they state "The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. Most people have resumed the wide range of normal activities, no longer restricted by the previous Covid measures. We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply." Recognising that the live streaming of Mass has been of great benefit during these times "Virtual Viewing of the Mass online does not fulfil the Sunday Obligation". Catholics are now encouraged to resume their normal Sunday Mass attendance from Pentecost this year. The full text of the Bishops' Statement can be found on the Homepage of the Parish Website.
