Dear Parents,

This week we have been thinking about our Gospel message in which we celebrated the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. In the Gospel, we are reminded that God loves us all so much that he was willing to send his only son, Jesus, to be with us here on earth, and die for us. Through listening to the Gospel, we have reflected on how we treat those that we love.

We have also been learning about the importance of being responsible and caring and preserving the earth's resources. This links with our focus Catholic Social Teachings of 'human dignity' and stewardship.' It also brings us a reminder of the pledges we made and followed to achieve our whole school 'Live Simply' award. It is important that, even though we have the award, we make this good practice part of our daily lifestyles - trying to save paper, recycling, turning off electrical equipment when not in use, etc.

We hope you found the welcome briefings that have taken place so far useful and informative in finding out more about the curriculum and what is expected in your child's new year group. Teachers will upload any slides or information to class pages if you missed it. Please ask if you have any questions about homework expectations. We are continuing with our handwriting scheme, 'Kinetic Letters.' This is working well and is a very in depth approach, teaching children about the foundations of handwriting - making our bodies stronger and holding the pencil correctly and then building on letter formation and fluency. We are also focusing on key skills for spelling and arithmetic, as well as putting an emphasis on reading fluency and comprehension. We know that you will support us with embedding these very important English and maths skills with the children.

As part of our induction to new classes, we have completed some beautiful art work around the theme of our Jubilee Year - Pilgrims of Hope.

We have been learning about a character called 'Luce.'

Luce wears a yellow rain jacket, which is coloured in reference to the flag of the Vatican City as well as a symbol for "journeying through life's storms". She carries a pilgrim's staff, which represents "the pilgrimage toward eternity", and wears mud-stained boots to represent "a long and difficult journey".

Her eyes have highlights in the shape of a scallop shell, a traditional symbol of Catholic pilgrimage.

Each class has taken Luce on an imaginary pilgrimage to a special place.

Parents' evenings will be on Tuesday 21st and Thursday 23rd October. More details to follow soon.


Prayer and Reflection
