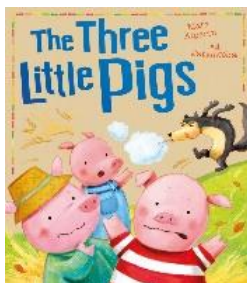




## Nursery Spring Term 1 Texts & Key Learning (Enchanted World)

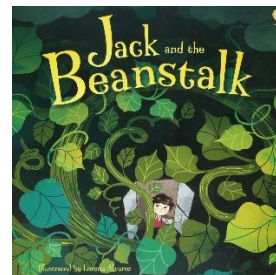

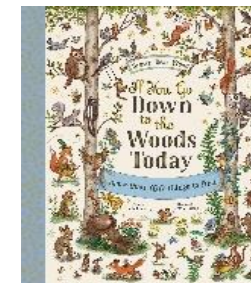
