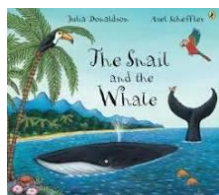


The Sea

One day on the Blue Planet – Non Fiction

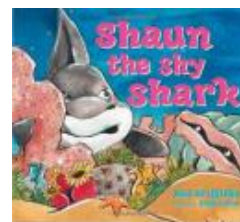

Aim - Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems and during role-play. Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others.

Shaun, however, was so shy that the sight of a jellyfish made him wobble, and even a shrimp was known to scare him. But it was his secret wish that eventually sent Shaun to a new world in a shipwreck at the bottom of the sea. It is a dazzling tale from the depths, about 'following a dream' and 'being different'.

Aim - Read individual letters by saying the sound. Recognising settings, and characters. Write short sentences with words with known sound-letter correspondences using a Capital letter and full stop.



Rainbow Fish – Marcus Pfister

"The Rainbow Fish is the story of a beautiful, colourful, and shiny fish with metallic scales that lives in the sea. Rainbow Fish loves his scales so much; he does not want to share them when asked by a blue fish. The blue fish is so hurt by Rainbow's Fishes' refusal to share that he no longer wants to be around him. Can rainbow fish be happy when no one wants to play with him?

Aim - Anticipate – where appropriate, Recall key events in stories. Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, Extend language when describing. Begin to write single words with sounds they can hear in order.
