ACC's COVID-19 Crisis Counselling Support Service is for everyone in the UK, whatever their faith, who has been bereaved during the time of the epidemic and anyone working within an NHS setting in a frontline role.

The service offers anyone who is eligible up-to ten sessions of counselling on a no-fee basis from a professionally trained counsellor.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

On this Solemnity, the liturgy invites us to praise God not merely for the wonders that he has worked, but for who he is; for the beauty and goodness of his being from which his action stems. We are invited to contemplate, so to speak, the Heart of God, his deepest reality which is his being One in the Trinity, a supreme and profound communion of love and life. The whole of Sacred Scripture speaks to us of him. Indeed, it is he who speaks to us of himself in the Scriptures and reveals himself as Creator of the universe and Lord of history. Today we heard a passage from the Book of Exodus in which - something quite exceptional - God proclaims his own Name! He does so in the presence of Moses with whom he spoke face to face, as with a friend. And what is God's Name? It never fails to move us: "The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness".

(Pope Benedict XVI)

Since arriving in the parish one thing which I have been keen to introduce is Devotions and Benediction on a Sunday afternoon/evening. At present, or at least before Covid-19, the only form of afternoon devotions on Sundays here at St. Mary of the Angels are the Stations of the Cross during Lent. For many of you, my parishioners, I am guessing that Benediction was a staple part of your religious and devotional life as you grew

up. Or, if you are amongst the younger generation of parishioner, you might never have had the opportunity to experience this part of our life of faith. Sadly, after the Second Vatican Council, this practice gradually disappeared until all we were left with was Mass. I would be interested to know if you would like to Sunday return to a Evening see Devotions. We could have Rosary and Benediction in May and October; Sacred Heart Devotions and Benediction in June: Stations and Benediction in Lent, and Evening Prayer and Benediction in the other months of the year. This, however, will only be possible if you are willing to support me in this venture. I truly believe that rekindling our devotional life as a parish will bring us many graces and blessings from the Lord. Please let me know if this is something that you would be willing to support as we continue to 'wait with joyful hope' for the day when things begin to get back to normal, and we see the opening of our churches once more.

And finally: Following the recent announcement by the Government and the Bishops' of England and Wales, we realise that for many this time could be a difficult and trying time for those who may have to selfisolate. Here at St Mary of the Angels we are putting into place a system where we can offer assistance to those who are most in need. If, for any reason, you as one of our parishioners, are in any kind of need, whether it be the need for some shopping to be delivered, or simply the sound of a friendly voice at the end of the phone, please do not hesitate to contact Fr.
