Dear Children,

Let's just think for a second about what you have had to do (draw a big tick by the ones you have achieved):

- 1. Not be in school and see your friends
- 2. Not go out to your favourite restaurants
- 3. Not go out as often to your favourite places
- 4. Work from home without teachers and friends to help
- 5. Not see your favourite aunties/uncles/cousins/grandparents except on social media
- 6. Not play out with your friends or invite them home
- 7. Help your Mums and Dads to understand the work that your teachers have set for you
- 8. Help your brothers and sisters more

If you have ALREADY done all of those things, then the next step of waiting and being patient is easy.

Now let's just think again about what gospel values you have achieved in all of those 8 points above:

- 1. Like Jesus, you have had to go without some of the things you wanted to do, without moaning- a bit like when He fasted in the desert, a bit like when we give up things for others during Lent.
- 2. Like Jesus, you have had to use your talents to help your family and your friends in different ways- a bit like when Jesus asked Peter to stop fishing for fish and to come and be a fisher of men a bit like when God asked Mary and Joseph to change their simple lives and become parents of the most important baby in the world, Jesus.
- 3. Like Jesus, you have been part of changing the world and the way the world behaves- a bit like when Jesus and John the Baptist told people they needed to change their ways through the parables like the story of the Lost Sheep and the story of the Prodigal Son and through John's baptism of many and of Jesus

4. Like Jesus, you may have lost people you loved – a bit like Mary standing at the foot of Jesus' cross

When you are as old as me, (er ... stop laughing or guessing thanks, no, I am not in triple figures yet!!) your children and their children will ask you, "What happened in 2020 Granny/Grandad?" and you will be able to tell them just how much you learned about:

- 1. your family and how your Mums and Dads cared for you and worked with you on all of your home learning, even when they were not quite sure. You were a great team! (and you did get over the arguments and smile at each other again!)
- 2. yourself and how you realised that going for a walk or a bike ride was actually something to really look forward to and worth doing every day.
