<u>Co-Vid update</u>_ Thank you to parents and staff for their respect, speed and attitude, yesterday, in safely ensuring that Y6 evacuated the site, in line with current isolation procedures. Thank you also to office staff for efficient communication and reassurance. We are missing you already, Y6 and staff, but know that Mrs Polito has great plans for you, via the class page. Mrs Polito will be sharing some of your work with me, across the week. Please stay safe so that we can see you again on Friday 20th November.

Staff will be contacting you across the day to share progress and next steps for all of your children. Almost all parents have now chosen time slots. Please remember staff will require you to be fair to all other waiting parents- all children are equally important. Please, however, be patient if phone calls are a little later than anticipated - staff will be doing their very best to keep to schedule, with your help.

<u>Living our faith</u>. We continue to be really delighted with your commitment to charity. Our Poppy Appeal, to date, has raised £147.50. Thank you very much, on behalf of the British legion. This closes on 22/11/20.

Normally, we would also be asking you to take your child/ren Christmas shopping, at this time of year- for a present to put under our Christmas tree. This year, we will instead be asking for a donation, via the Gateway, towards schools in our locality with significantly deprived pupils. Their head teachers have already said that they wpould be extremely grateful. Other news ...

Security gates-Good news! We have secured a £60,000+grant to improve site security. This will mean that the car park and front entrance will only be accessible through security controlled gates and a video recognition system. It will also mean that the spate of unwanted visitors that we have experienced in the past, will no longer have access on site. Work will commence during the February half term. It will mean some temporary disruption , but the long term gain will be worth it.

<u>Christmas Activities</u>- We intend to celebrate Christmas in many ways such as: a virtual visit from Santa; a streamed version of the nativities or of prayer services; a variation on the traditional carol services anda collection, onsite for local foodbanks.
