- Autumn Term Progress Charts these will be sent out to you by early next week. Staff have prepared these as an interim report for you. They link to the parents' consultations, last term, and will benefit you as you support your children's homework and home learning. They indicate the areas that your child really needs to develop in order to progress further.

3. Thanks Parents; home school liaison is effectively supporting children – the

communication evident in almost all cases, across school is really great. Thank you- that makes our job so much easier as we have a duty of care to know that your child is safe and is accessing their work in line with their entitlements. The quality and ingenuity of the work is really encouraging for teachers and their teaching assistants (and me) to see. It makes their efforts all very worthwhile. - 5. Site safety- we have in excess of 110 children and their parents on site each morning and afternoon. These numbers are substantially higher than other local schools. We are happy to provide for these children to support the greater good during CoVid 19. However, in return, please can I remind all parents that there is an expectation that social distancing will be fully supported. Thank you so very much to almost all parents who really are looking after our staff by maintaining those distances, wearing masks and leaving the site quickly.

Home Learning Well done to lots of children and

parents who are responding to teachers' and teaching assistants' comments. We now need you to:

- Always use the video link first it teaches the children
- Encourage them to listen and respond by pausing the video each time and following the advice
- Challenge them with their handwriting and their spelling
- Send the work in and look at the comments staff are making

What's all this about "yes yellow"?

Next week in their videos, teachers will be expecting children to edit their work, in the way we do in school. Teachers will be asking children AFTER they have finished their work, to look for some examples of: good word choices, or capital letters, or a spelling pattern, or a well formed number or letter, etc. When children spot these, they are asked to "yes yellow" them (It can be ANY colour or even underline or circle the word). It just reminds them about what they already know is expected in their writing. Give it a try- it will immediately improve their concentration and their sense of achievement, if you do. Remember, use any colour! ©
