

Almighty God, teach us to listen to your Son, to accept his wisdom and acknowledge that He alone is the way, the truth and the life.

What does CAFOD do with your donations?

CAFOD has been helping communities in several countries around the world cope with the current pandemic. In Zambia, for example, in the past year, our Catholic Charity has been able to reach 1,234,200 people with guidance messages on COVID-19, provide 13,312 people with access to safe water, train 392 frontline health workers from Zambia's 11 diocese on how to respond to COVID-19 and has donated over 1000 hand washing hygiene stations to them. So, the organisers and officers of CAFOD thank you for standing alongside people in Zambia and others in more than 30 other countries.

In 2015 in his encyclical "*Laudato Si*" (ss28-03) Pope Francis made these points: "Fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance... Water poverty especially affects Africa, where large sectors of the population have no access to safe drinking water...

Every day, unsafe water results in many deaths and the spread of water-related diseases... Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity."

In response, CAFOD is now running a major campaign to bring the supply of safe water to people in impoverished countries.

And finally:- If Jesus walked among us today, performed miracles and taught us, I wonder how we would treat him? Would we have the faith to allow him to perform miracles of healing among us? There are so many who see only what is human in the Church and do not have the eyes to see that the Church is also divine, just as Our Lord was both human and divine, and that the Church continues the ministry of the Word made flesh. There are so many who believe that the Church has no right to speak out on matters pertaining to morality and the way that people live, just as the people of Nazareth wanted to silence the Lord. If Jesus walked among us today I wonder how we would treat him?
