### **CAFOD NEWS**

As you will recall our parish has been supporting an area in Columbia – Magdalena Medio. This is through CAFOD's "HANDS ON" Project to help young school students, to build community, to promote the peace settlement, to counteract violence and to bring aid to poor families.

Recently CAFOD sent us some bad news, which is, of course, also good news for Christians, in the same sense as the martyrdom of Archbishop Oscar Romero over two decades ago in El Salvador.

CAFOD is sorry to tell us that Carlota Isabel Salina Perez was killed last March. She was part of our peace-building project in Magdalena Medio. She worked alongside other local experts in an area women's group. Carlota was a mother of three, a proud protector of the environment and a courageous human rights defender. She supported her community with love and care, continuously - even during her final days. On the day of her killing she had been organising food supplies for local families affected by Coronavirus. At her home at 8 o'clock in the evening she was shot dead. She was 38 years old. It is important that Carlota's death does not go unnoticed. Her life and work are to be valued. Those responsible for her killing need to be brought to justice. As Catholics we know that death is not the end. CAFOD asks us to join in praying for Carlota - that she may rest in peace. Others there in Columbia are, thanks be to God, continuing the same work

And finally: In 1979, shortly after his election, Pope St. John Paul II made a Papal visit to his home country of Poland. During this visit he went to his hometown of Wadowice, and to the church which he had known from his earliest days. Upon entering the church the Pope made his way straight to the font, knelt down, and kissed it. He did this because he knew that the most important day of his life was not his ordination as a priest, his consecration as a bishop, or even his election as Pope - but the day of his baptism! In a similar vain, at the beginning of the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis encouraged all Christians to make a pilgrimage to the font where they were baptised, and to find out the date on which their baptism took place saying: "To know the day of your Baptism is to know a blessed day". Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we celebrate the moment when Christ the giver of baptism, made holy the waters in which we would one day be baptised. On the day of our baptism, we were not only set free from Original Sin, we were "immersed into the inexhaustible source of life which is the death of Jesus, the greatest act of love in all of history" (Pope Francis). Today, as we celebrate this feast, may our hearts be filled with thanksgiving for the gift of our baptism, for the life promised to us in Christ; and let us pray that each day, throughout this year, we may experience ever more the graces we received on the day of our baptism.
