The Seder Plate

Beitzah - hardboiled egg
symbolises the festival offerings
brought to the Holy Temple.

Zeroa - shank bone
symbolises the lamb
sacrificed at the Holy
Temple in ancient
times.

Karpas -
vegetable
such as parsley,
onion or potato
is dipped in salt water
and symbolises tears.

Maror - bitter herbs

Charoset -
mix of apple,
nuts, spices and wine
symbolises bricks and
mortar to show the
hard work of a slave.

Key Facts

Holy Week celebrates the last week of the life of Jesus here on earth.

Jesus was preparing in Holy Week to die for others.

The crowd shout "Lord", "King of Israel", "Son of David" as Jesus enters Jerusalem

The celebration of the Last Supper took place during the Jewish celebration of Passover.

The priest takes the place of Jesus at the celebration of Mass, doing what he did at the Last Supper.

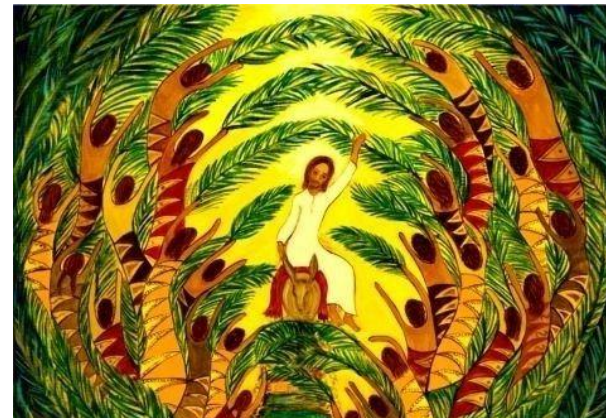
The priest says the words of Jesus at the Last supper "This is my body. Take it and eat it, do this is memory of me"
