And finally:- One of the good things to come out of the past 18 months is the realisation of, and appreciation for, those things in our lives which really matter. The truth is, for all of us, that we carry around with us so much 'baggage', so many things which we worry about and fret over that sometimes we can loose sight of the things which are really and truly important. Today we encounter in the Gospel the famous saying of our Lord that "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God". The 'Eye of the Needle' was of course one of the principle gates in the wall of the City of Jerusalem, a gate through which many traders with their goods laden camels would have to pass in order to enter into the city. The problem was, the gate was very narrow. In order to get through the camels would have to be unburdened of their loads. Casting off the shackles that weigh us down can often be a difficult and painful task, but it is worth while in the end, for it is only then we begin to truly appreciate the things that really matter. We might not have to 'pass through the eye of a needle', but de-cluttering our lives allows the truly important things in life to enter more easily through the gateway of our hearts.
